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STATE OF THE ART TECHNOLOGY BRINGS STERLING FOREST TO LIFE

The New York – New Jersey Trail Conference is pleased to announce the publication of the Second Edition of Sterling Forest Trails, an updated guide to nearly 60 miles of hiking trails interspersed over 20,000 acres of public land only 45 miles from midtown Manhattan.

Sterling Forest includes spectacular natural settings featuring mountainous cliffs, dense second growth woodlands, lakes, and marshes, and offers dazzling vistas of the state. The map includes the contiguous parklands of Passaic County Park and Wanaque Wildlife Management Area in New Jersey, the western edge of Harriman State Park in New York, and the Appalachian Trail Corridor from the New Jersey border to Harriman.

Hikers and outdoor enthusiasts will appreciate the durable quality of this map: the waterproof and tear-proof Tyvek material can endure years of active use. The 12" x 17" map ensures easy reading of its details, while folding to fit comfortably in pocket or pack.

Vivid six-color graphics on the map's front side clearly depict the full range of the area's geographic features, including topological contours and landforms; rivers, streams, lakes, and wetlands; woodlands and fields; viewpoints; access points, including parking areas and park facilities.

Precise trail locations have been verified by GPS data; UTM grids have been superimposed for GPS users. Revisions to the first edition include recent trail developments and relocations as well as routes of trails proposed by the Trails Working Group's Interim Trails Plan. No-hunting zones in areas adjacent to the park are also indicated.

The map includes a brief history of the Sterling Forest Park, trail descriptions, public transportation resources, useful telephone numbers and websites, park regulations and permitted uses, water sources, woods roads, and hunting regulations affecting specified areas.

The maps are available from local outdoor stores, or directly from the Trail Conference.

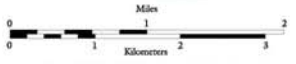
